

GEF GRANT IN ACTION

COMPUTER ACCESS GRANT ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY FOR STUDENTS

The Glenview Education Foundation awarded a Computer Access Grant in the fall of 2019 to Erin Ross, the Assistive Technology Facilitator for District 34. This grant benefits District 34 students with physical challenges that require alternative access methods for using



a computer or tablet. GEF provided the funds for a head mouse, eye gaze, an iPad Pro, and supporting software to be used in assistive technology evaluations.

Using the purchased tools, our students are evaluated and matched to the most beneficial technology for their needs. Using specialized games, the students begin to learn to use the assistive technology tool. It takes a lot of practice and time to develop the skills and endurance to become a proficient user of these tools.

Eventually, our students can apply their skills using assistive technology to academic tasks assigned by their teachers. Learning and using these specialized tools will allow district 34 students with physical disabilities to access to computers without needing assistance. For some, using assistive technology has enabled them to produce digital art and type independently for the first time. The technology allows our students to advance their independence and give them more inclusive opportunities with their classmates.

"The technology granted by the GEF to conduct alternative access assessments for computers and tablets has leveled the playing field for students with physical disabilities to be able to access the curriculum independently without a scribe. For students with physical disabilities to be able to access a computer and/or tablet improves their quality of life now more than ever; for the following reasons: to be able to stay connected in our virtual world, it allows them to have computer skills to have a job one day and have the chance to attend higher education independently." - Erin Ross, Assistive Technology Facilitator for District 34

The Computer Access Grant has been a great success and the district will be purchasing additional eye trackers, software, and other hightech tools to support assistive technology evaluations. 

CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR SPRING GRANT RECIPIENTS!

Thank you to all District 34 educators for their participation in the spring grant application process. GEF is proud to announce the approval of the Middle School Maker Modules grant submitted by David Ristow, Jeremy Fischer, Laura NeKola, and Mary Alonzi.

The Maker Modules grant will fund the completion of five Middle School Maker Modules for Attea and Springman to teach engineering skills, design thinking, and inquiry dispositions for students through the 8th grade. These 6-8 Maker Modules directly build upon the foundational learning of the K-2 and 3-5 Maker Modules, generously funded by the GEF in 2017, and strengthen the transition to STEM opportunities provided by Glenbrook South High School.

To expand on the success of the Maker Modules at the primary and intermediate schools in D34, this middle school update uses the same core module topics - Construction, Circuitry, and Robotics & Coding - and adds two new modules that focus on real-world application and impact: Digital Design & Production and Entrepreneurship.

GEF is proud to support the funding of these additional STEM materials for our District 34 schools. Our middle schoolers will use the new supplies to help tackle question such as:

- How do we apply the laws of physics to the construction of structures and objects?
- How do we apply our knowledge of circuits to solve authentic everyday problems?
- How do we use coding and robotics to create problem-solving machines?
- How can design principles and quality production enhance communication?
- How can the D34 inquiry process intersect with an entrepreneur mindset?
